Travel Journals 4: Ways to present the travel journal

- Buy a scrapbook. Paste in the lined paper after you have written your journal entry. Remember to draw, decorate or add brochures and tickets.
- If you like to draw, consider an artist's sketchpad. The text can be written directly onto the page or onto lined paper that can be pasted onto the page.
- Use a computer. This is a good idea if you take a lot of photos and store them digitally.
- If you are writing on paper, consider an A4 display folder with sheets that slide in and out of
 plastic sleeves. They are well protected but easy to access so you can add photos or pictures
 cut from brochures to help illustrate your journal

Remember:

- Collect brochures from places you visit. The local travel bureau always has a good selection of brochures
- Buy a postcard from each town you visit and paste it into the journal
- Save ticket stubs from train rides, theme parks, national parks, zoos, and other attractions and put them into the journal.
