



My personal interests are netball, reading, cooking and travelling.


Three words that describe me are outgoing, ambitious and adventurous.

One piece of advice to succeed at SIDE is to never let yourself fall behind and to try and be ahead on assignments.




Tessa Bergmann

My personal interests are working within the agricultural industry where I enjoy working with the sheep.


Three words that describe me are dedicated, hardworking and caring.

My personal interests are dancing, friends and family, travelling and animals.


Three words that describe me are kind, positive and humble.

My personal interests are surfing and fitness.


Three words that describe me are gullible, outgoing and funny.

My personal interests are gaming and trampolining.


Three words that describe me are polite, kind and caring.

My personal interests are movies, family and my pets.


Three words that describe me are funny, kind and happy.

My personal interests are landscaping, fishing and cars.


Three words that describe me are creative, hardworking and knowledgeable.

My personal interests are dancing, learning and travelling.


Three words that describe me are diligent, optimistic and independent.



Three words that describe me are confident, friendly and assertive.


In 2020 I plan to move to Albany and further my studies. I was also thinking of taking a gap year to figure out what I want to become in life.
