

# YARNING CIRCLE ARTWORK COMPETITION TERMS & CONDITIONS

SCHOOL OF ISOLATED AND DISTANCED EDUCATION

## 1. Eligibility

- 1.1. This competition is open exclusively to students currently enrolled in SIDE partner schools in Western Australia.
- 1.2. There is no limit to the number of artworks each school may submit.
- 1.3. There is no limit to how many students can contribute to one entry.
- 1.4. Schools must submit artwork representing only the region in which they are located. The eligible regions are:
  - Wheat Belt/Peel
  - Mid West
  - Southwest / Great Southern
  - Goldfields/Esperance
  - Kimberley
  - Pilbara
  - Gascoyne
- 1.5. For students who are enrolled at SIDE and are not located within one of the previous mentioned regions; a school in one of those regions must be nominated on their behalf. If successful, prizes will be awarded to the nominated school, and the student will be recognised with a certificate. See Section 4 for more detail.

## 2. Artwork Requirements

- 2.1. Artwork should be reflective of your region, community or school. This could include but not limited to representations of the landscape, local stories, native flora and notable people in the community.
- 2.2. All entries must be original, created by the students, and not previously submitted to other competitions.
- 2.3. Artwork can be in any medium (painting, drawing, digital art, mixed media, etc.)
- 2.4. Offensive, discriminatory, or inappropriate content will not be accepted.
- 2.5. AI-generated content will not be accepted.

## 3. Submission Process

- 3.1. Artworks must be emailed through to [side.communications@education.wa.edu.au](mailto:side.communications@education.wa.edu.au) before 11.59pm 22<sup>nd</sup> August, 2025.
- 3.2. Format to be either JPEG, PNG or PDF and must not exceed the file size 20MB.
- 3.3. Each entry must follow the template provided and include the school name, as well as the name and year group of students who contributed to the artwork.
- 3.4. Late or incomplete submissions will not be considered.

## 4. Judging and Prizes

- 4.1. The selection panel will evaluate entries based on creativity, originality, and their representation of their region.
- 4.2. The decision is final, no correspondence will be entered into.
- 4.3. Winners will be announced on SIDE's website ([www.side.wa.edu.au/](http://www.side.wa.edu.au/)) and notified through their school.
- 4.4. A prize will be awarded to the winning school from each region; a voucher to local art supplies store valued at \$500.

## 5. Rights and Usage

- 5.1. By entering, students and schools grant SIDE the right to display, publish, and use the artworks for promotional purposes, including but not limited to signage, exhibitions, social media, and print materials.
- 5.2. Artists will always be credited when their work is used.

## 6. Liability and Privacy

- 6.1. Personal information collected will only be used for competition purposes and will not be shared with third parties.
- 6.2. SIDE is not liable for any lost or damaged files during the submission process or subsequent use.

## 7. Agreement

- 7.1. By submitting entries, schools confirm that all participating students and their parents/guardians have agreed to these terms and conditions.
