Junior Bibliography

- Basic selection of sources.
- Citations are created using an abridged Harvard Author-Date system.
- Copy and paste result into bibliography.

Middle School Bibliography

- Wide range of sources.
- Rollover describes each element of the citation.
- Enter details into the Harvard Online Referencing Generator - copy and paste into bibliography in alphabetical order.

Senior Bibliography

- Comprehensive range of sources.
- Rollover describes each element of the citation.
- Enter details into the Harvard Online Referencing Generator - copy and paste into bibliography in alphabetical order.
- In-text reference examples are given.

- Type all required information about your resource over the example in each box and click 'Create citation'.

4. **Copy and paste the citation** created into your bibliography (Word document or other).

- Put your **reference list into alphabetical order**, using the letter/s of the first word in each citation (usually author surname or title of resource).

Your citation. Select, copy and paste it into your document.

Note: Arrange references in alphabetical order by the first word, which is usually an author's last or family name. Ignore A, An or The as first words of a title for the list order.
